RESOLUTION

The 10th September 1993

**SUBJECT**—Acceptance of the list of Socially and Educationally Backward Classes recommended by Justice N. K. Das Commission—Reservation for Socially & Educationally Backward Classes in services under the State Government.

Justice N. K. Das Commission was set up on the 3rd February 1991 to identify Socially and Educationally Backward Classes of citizens in the State of Orissa for the purpose of extending benefits with reference to the Mandal Commission's Report and to lay down the economic criteria which will constitute the basis for allowing the benefits. The Commission has since submitted its report to Government on the 28th June, 1993. While submitting its report, the Das Commission has made the following substantive findings.

- (a) Rectification of the list prepared by the Mandal Commission by excluding castes and communities who really belong to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes and have no ethnic origin in Orissa ;
- (b) Surnames included in the Mandal Commission list as castes are to be replaced by the appropriate castes ;
- (c) People of some communities who are to be added to the list being synonymous with the existing castes in the Mandal list ;
- (d) Serial Nos. and entries relating to one community are to be clubbed together as they are synonymous ;
- (e) Only one new entry to include Naga-Vasam Mahisya and Saunties has been made.

Government have carefully considered the recommendations of the Das Commission Report and have been pleased to modify the list of the O. B. Cs prepared by the Mandal Commission for the State of Orissa and accept Das Commission's recommendations. The list of Socially and Educationally Backward Classes as derived on the above basis and accepted by the State Government is at Annexure 'A'. The economic criteria duly recommended by the Das Commission for the purpose of exclusion of the 'Creamy Layer' amongst the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes on the basis of the report of the Expert Committee headed by Justice Ram Nandan Prasad constituted by Government of India as per the direction of the Honorable Supreme Court of India are also accepted by the Government.

Accordingly the following decisions are taken:—

- (1) 12% of the vacancies in Civil Posts and Services under the State will be reserved for the Socially and Educationally Backward Classes subject to exclusion of Creamy Layer as recommended by Expert Committee under the Chairmanship of Justice Ram Nandan Prasad, for the State of Orissa in initial/direct recruitment on the basis of 1981 Census figure until further orders ; detailed instructions relating to the procedure to be followed for enforcing reservation will be issued separately ;
- (2) The above reservation is subject to revision of percentage of reservation for Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe on the basis of 1991 Census figure ;
- (3) The other benefits will be considered by the Government in due course.

This will come in to force from the date of issue of the Resolution.

**ORDER**—Ordered that the Resolution be published in the extra-ordinary issue of the State Gazette and copies thereof be sent to all Departments of Government and all Heads of Departments.
